After graduating from Banard Public School, through the influence of Msgr. John Ambot and the Sisters in Hartford, Connecticut she entered the Prep School in Millvale. At that time, the need for teachers was so great that as a postulant she was given the 4th grade class in Elizabeth, New Jersey, with 86 students to teach.

Sister spent 40 years of teaching from Hartford, CT in the East to Kenosha in the Mid-West. She spent 15 years teaching at St. George School in Philadelphia where she was principal and 7 years at St. Casimir's on the South Side, as well as spending other years teaching in other schools, first in the intermediate grades and later, the upper grades.

In several schools she added the duties of Principal and Local Superior to her classroom duties. Her last assignments, in 1958-59, were catechetical work at St. Andrew's in New Britain, Connecticut as well as the St. Francis Mission Center in Harrison, NJ.
