In addition to teaching grade school, Sister Constance did catechetical work and was CCD director for several years.

Sister Constance retired from teaching at the age of 76. She was talented, amazing and loved wherever she went. Sister Constance was a people person, a lover of people.

On Good Friday, 2008 she asked to receive the Sacrament of the Sick after her health took a serious downturn. Sister Constance remained at peace until she received the grace of a happy death.
